**Gentleman Jack**

*Notes: Tennessee's answer to fine Cognac. Gentleman Jack receives a double-blessing of charcoal mellowing, once before aging and once after. Silky and soft, caramel, black currant and mandarin orange notes, laced with vanilla and smoke. Rich aromas of honey, nuts and oak. Complex flavors of leather, tobacco, coffee and raisins. Warm but mellow finish. Clear amber/honey color. Enjoy neat, on the rocks, or with a splash of water.*

*Review: Wine Enthusiast(03/01/2011) - This honey-colored whiskey is mellow, smooth, mouthwatering and delicious. Rich and pretty caramel and citrus aromas precede complex flavors of leather, tobacco, vanilla and cocoa. Its long finish displays lots of caramel, spicy cinnamon and ginger. Pair with a Cigar.*

*Medium-dark ruby; attractive, slightly herbaceous, cedary, black raspberry aroma with notes of green olive, tobacco, black pepper, and pencil shavings; full body; tight, textured, cedary, blackberry flavors; full tannin; rough and a bit austere on the finish; lingering aftertaste.*
